# Part 2 of the Global Aviation Safety Roadmap to be delivered to ICAO today

CHERTSEY 4 DEC: Later today the Industry Safety Strategy Group (ISSG), which has developed a Global Aviation Safety Roadmap in cooperation with the International Civil Aviation Organisation (ICAO), will formally deliver Part 2 of the project.

Part 2 of the Roadmap outlines strategies for achieving the goals set out in Part 1 of the Roadmap which the ISSG delivered to ICAO in December of 2005 and was endorsed by the Directors General of Civil Aviation Conference in March 2006. Part 1 of the Roadmap identified 12 main Focus Areas to correct inconsistencies in air safety oversight and regulation. These included: the implementation of international standards, incident and accident investigation and regional co-ordination of programmes.. IFALPA believes that the Roadmap will be a very positive step in advancing aviation safety in that it will allow safety efforts to be focused and prioritized to maximize the impact of always scarce resources.

IFALPA is proud to be a member of the ISSG that developed the Roadmap, the publication of which is sure to be seen as a milestone in aviation safety development. IFALPA will continue to work with ICAO and its ISSG partners as the Roadmap is incorporated into ICAO's Global Aviation Safety Plan (GASP).
