



Professor Peter Turnbull

Peter Turnbull (BA Econ, MA, PhD) is Professor of Management & Industrial Relations in the New School of Management at the University of Bristol. He previously held posts at the Universities of Cardiff, Leeds, Warwick, and the London School of Economics (LSE), and visiting posts at Queens University (Belfast), Melbourne, Monash, La Trobe, RMIT (Australia) and Cornell (USA).

He is the co-author of two aviation reports for the International Labour Organization (ILO), on the employment and social impact of 9/11 and the recent financial crisis on the global civil aviation sector. In 2011, Professor Turnbull was Visiting Academic Fellow at the ILO (Geneva) where he worked on projects to promote social dialogue and the employment of women in the transport sector.

Professor Turnbull has also produced reports for the European Transport Workers' Federation (ETF) on the impact of Low Fares Airlines (LFAs). He previously worked with the European Cockpit Association (ECA) on an EU-funded project on Trans-National Representation and Collective Bargaining in Europe, and more recently contributed three country case studies to the Ghent University study for the ECA on Atypical Employment in Aviation.

Professor Turnbull is currently working with the European social partners in air traffic management to promote a *Toolbox for Successful Social Dialogue*. He is an Academic Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Personnel & Development (CIPD) and a member of the Advisory, Conciliation and Arbitration Service (ACAS) arbitration panel.
